Woodbridge is one of five comprehensive high schools in the Irvine Unified School District.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

The Irvine Unified School District requires two hundred fifteen credits earned in grades 9 - 12 in various subjects and academic disciplines including 20 credits (four semesters) of Physical Education and 5 credits (one semester) of Health. GRADING SYSTEM

The marking system is based on a 4.0 scale for the grade of A. Plus or minus marks are not computed. Honors courses in grades eleven and twelve, and all Advanced Placement courses receive one extra grade point when the grade earned is a C or above. Class rank is not computed. A passing grade for high school credit is a D-.

MOST RIGOROUS COURSE OFFERINGS

Woodbridge high school offers 23 Advanced Placement Courses including: AP Human Geography, AP World History, AP US History, AP US Government, AP Macro Economics, AP English Lang. & Comp., AP English Lit. & Comp., AP Statistics, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Physics, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Latin, AP Spanish, AP Chinese, AP Computer Science, AP Computer Science Principles, AP Psychology, AP Studio Art, AP 3D Studio Art, and AP Music Theory. The following Honors Courses are also available: Honors English 1, Honors American Literature, Honors Geometry, Honors Algebra 2, Honors Pre-Calculus, Honors Biology, Honors Chemistry, Honors Latin 3, Honors Spanish 4.

All advanced placement courses and underlined honors courses (noted above) receive a weighted grade.

CONCURRENT INSTRUCTION AND INTERNATIONAL RECORDS POLICIES

Irvine Unified District guidelines state that credit will be granted for coursework completed at an institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (i.e., WASC). Independent study and online courses will be issued a grade of "P" Pass or "F" Fail only. 45% of the Class of 2016 opted to take at least one class through local community colleges. Many students choose to take college classes to earn transferrable college credit as well as fulfill high school graduation requirements. When students opt to include college classes on their high school transcript, the courses will be posted as an un-weighted letter grade.

Students with international records will receive a "P" Pass or "F" Fail grade on their Woodbridge High School transcript for courses taken outside the United States. Students are encouraged to provide a copy of their original international records directly to colleges and universities for grade interpretation as warranted.

ATHLETIC PROGRAM

Woodbridge High School is a member of the Pacific Coast League which is governed by the Southern Section of the California Inter-scholastic Federation. Over 1200 student athletes (48%) participate in some form of interscholastic competition. Sportsmanship, team-work and integrity are core values which are stressed at every level of participation. Sports teams include: cross country, track, softball, baseball, golf, tennis, volleyball, basketball, football, water polo, swimming, wrestling, soccer and lacrosse. WHS athletes have excelled and won numerous league and CIF championships in a variety of sports.

SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENTS, AWARDS, & HONORS

Students at Woodbridge are encouraged to engage the world beyond the classroom. Recent achievements include:

- WHS Math team placed 3rd at both the OCC Math Meet and the Cal State Long Beach Math Meet
- WHS sent 20 teams to the High School Mathematics Contest in Modeling (HiMCM), an international competition where 9 teams earned meritorious standing.
- At the California Science Fair, 3 individual students win medals at the State Level.
- The Science Olympiad team represented WHS at the State level and 2 students won individual medals in Bridge Building.
- In athletics, 15-16 highlights were league championships in Cross Country, girls' basketball, baseball, Boys & Girls Track and Field. CIF championships in Boys Track and Girls swimming and a CIF runner up in Baseball
