GUIDELINES FOR THE STUDENT ATHLETE

CODE OF HONOR

The Athletic Code of Honor is established to ensure that the highest level of competition is conducted at Woodbridge High School. Each participant must commit to an exemplary level of conduct and behavior as a representative of the school, the community, and the Irvine Unified School District.

As a participant in Woodbridge High School Athletics, I agree to the following:

1. The student athlete's primary responsibility is academic achievement.
2. Meet the eligibility requirements as stated in the IUSD Board Policy 6145.1.
 - Previous quarter GPA 2.0
 - Pass 4 classes previous quarter
 - Enrollment in at least 25 units; enrollment in at least 20 units for second semester seniors.
3. As a representative of Woodbridge, inside and outside of school, I will always demonstrate integrity and uphold the highest standard of behavior.
4. Suspension for any offenses against established educational codes could result in athletic ineligibility during the time of suspension. Use or possession of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, drug paraphernalia, e-cigarettes or narcotics will be grounds for permanent athletic ineligibility. Athletes will refrain from profanity, cheating, or illegal tactics.
5. Hazing will not be tolerated in any form. Conviction of hazing could lead to immediate removal from the team and potential referral for expulsion.
6. Jewelry will not be worn during athletic contests - per the CIF Officials Code for Safety. Athletes will dress neatly and wear shoes when traveling to an event.
7. To remain a team member throughout the season of sport. An athlete quitting a team after the season has begun cannot participate in another sport until his/her season has ended.
8. Head Coach of respective sport or Athletic Director may set certain standards of behavior and appropriate consequences.
9. Athletes are financially responsible for all athletic equipment checked out to them.
10. Any violation of the rules and standards may result in suspension from athletics for the remainder of the season. Appeals on eligibility issues or disciplinary actions will be reviewed by appropriate administrators and coaches.

Notice of Non-discrimination in Athletics

IUSD does not discriminate in enrollment in or access to any athletics program available. Admission to these programs is based on age appropriateness, team roster space, aptitude and meeting academic and behavioral eligibility requirements. The lack of English skills shall not be a barrier to admission to or participation in the District's activities and programs. IUSD's facilities and equipment provided for students are comparable and equitable to both sexes without disparity or imbalance, consistent with his or her gender identity, irrespective of the gender listed on the pupil's record. Notice of Course Repeat

According to Education Code section 51228.2; 5 CCR section 1700 athletics courses have been designed to be taken more than once: Even though the Pupil may have previously completed the course and received a grade determined by the District to be sufficient to satisfy the District's minimum requirements for high school graduation and to satisfy the requirements for admission to the California public institutions of postsecondary education.
